**DECISION OF THE SECRETARY**

This matter comes before me on appeal by Respondent of an Initial Decision issued by Chief Administrative Judge Ernest C. Canellos on July 28, 2008. Respondent requests that I review the findings of the Initial Decision and find that Respondent met its burden of proof showing that its disbursements of Federal student financial aid funds were proper. Respondent also offers to provide me with additional information, if I forward my request to the institution's director.

Judge Canellos held that Respondent did not meet its burden of proof. The judge's ruling was based on his determination that Respondent failed to present any evidence in support of the institution's position that the questioned Title IV disbursements were proper. As such, I find no reason to modify the judge's findings. Postsecondary institutions are required to account for the expenditure of Title IV funds when requested to do so; Respondent did not. Accordingly, the questioned expenditures must be returned to the Department.

**ORDER**

ACCORDINGLY, the Initial Decision by Chief Administrative Judge Ernest C. Canellos is HEREBY AFFIRMED as the Final Decision of the Department.
